The Barbie story has always been about sharing the importance of friendship. In honoring Barbie's birthday, our craft is making paper girl & boy dolls holding friendship hands.




The first Barbie doll was introduced in both blonde and brunette in March 1959.







Daylight Savings Time 2021 begins on March 14 at 2 am. We change our clock ahead 1 hour so there will be more daylight hours during the summer months. We spring ahead 1 hour in spring. We fall back 1 hour in the fall. Your coo coo clock is set for story time – 11 am. Color the clock, and then cut out the clock along its outside shape. Next, you can choose the coo coo bird you like to fit in the window. See the sets of shapes under the clock? There are 2 long rectangles and 2 pinecones by the birds. Carefully cut out the birds, the long rectangles & the pinecones after coloring them. Glue the 2 long rectangles to the bottom back of the clock. Glue each pinecone on top of the long rectangles. Glue your bird in the window. Ask questions about time.

Step 1: Fold the Paper in Half

Step 2: Fold the Top Half Down

Step 3: Flip the Paper and Fold Again


Step 4: Ensure You Have an Accordion Fold

Step 5: Cut the Paper Strip in Half

Step 6: Draw a Doll Silhouette

Step 7: Cut Out the Doll

Step 8: Unfold the Paper



Instructions to make a paper doll chain

Fold paper down in half. Crease well.

Fold in half again one side then turn over & fold the other side. You'll have a wide folded paper. Fold from left to right to make the width of the folded paper smaller, then cut in half.

The 2 papers should look like an accordion, back & forth.

Trace your girl &/or boy shapes onto the folded papers. Make sure each hand reached the edge on both sides.

Cut out carefully. Pull apart for your chain of friends.



10 Most Influential Women in the World 2021 <https://www.biographyonline.net/women/10-influential-women.html>

It is hard to select a top 10, but these women have all had a significant influence on different aspects of life and people today. Some as writers, some as role models, some for their achievements.



1. Mother Teresa (1910-1997) – Mother Teresa devoted her life to serving the poor and disadvantaged. She is an example of selfless charity and has inspired many to be more charitable and selfless themselves. Her philosophy was to act with love, and even smallest acts could have a big influence.



2. Eleanor Roosevelt (1884-1962) – Eleanor Roosevelt was the wife of American president F.D. Roosevelt. She also campaigned for universal human rights. She was head of the UN human rights commission which drafted the 1948 UN Declaration of Human Rights. This is a framework for the greater importance of human rights issues in the post-war period.



3. Marie Curie (1867-1934) – Marie Curie was the first woman to receive the Nobel Prize, and she went on to be awarded a Nobel Prize for both Chemistry (1911) and Physics (1903). Her achievement was more remarkable given the limited number of women admitted into science in that era. Marie Curie's discoveries played an important role in the development of radioactivity and the X-Ray.



4. Susan B. Anthony (1820-1906) – Susan Anthony was an active campaigner against slavery and for the promotion of women's and workers rights. She played a key role in changing attitudes during the Nineteenth Century. Supported by many other supporters, she helped lay the groundwork for later laws which gave women the vote and greater rights.



5. Margaret Fuller (1810-1850) was an American women's rights advocate. Her book *Women in the Nineteenth Century* (1845) was influential in changing perceptions about men

and women and was one of the most important early feminist works. She argued for equality and women being more self-dependent and less dependent on men. Although she was not a political activist, her works and writings were influential in shaping later activists.



6. Diana, Princess of Wales (1961-1997) – Princess Diana combined the appeal of a Royal princess with her humanitarian charity work. Although her marriage to Prince Charles was overshadowed by affairs on both sides, her popularity remained undimmed as many were inspired by her natural sympathy with the poor and mistreated.



7. Oprah Winfrey (1954 –) Influential talk show host, Oprah Winfrey has had a profound influence on American culture in the past few decades. Through her books and talk show, she has raised a whole range of issues, such as spirituality and self-improvement.



8. Mary Wollstonecraft (1759-1797) – Mary Wollstonecraft wrote a very significant book in the early feminist movement. “*A Vindication of the Rights of Women*” was one of the earliest examples of a book which laid a very clear framework for extending political and human rights to women. Her ideas were radical at the time but would become increasingly accepted in later centuries.



9. Rosa Parks (1913-2005) – Rosa Parks played a key role in the American civil rights movement. Her refusal to give up her seat on a segregated bus led to a nationwide campaign against apartheid in southern states. She became a leading figurehead and spokesperson for equality and the promotion of civil rights.



10. J.K. Rowling (1965 –) J.K. Rowling is the author of the phenomenal best selling Harry Potter series. The volume of sales was so high, it has been credited with leading a revival of reading by children. She wrote the first book as a single mother, struggling to make ends meet, but is now one of the most successful self-made women.
