Museum Pass Spotlight: National Museum of Industrial History

This museum pass is the newest addition to our museum pass collection! Check it out from the Whitehall Township Public Library! Current **museum exhibits** include "Robert Fulton Industrious Revolutionary" and other permanent exhibits. Go to the National Museum of Industrial History's website (https://www.nmih.org/) for more information.

Museum passes are free to check out with your LCLC Library Card. This pass allows for up to **two adults and four children**.



You can **check out museum passes** from the library for one week with no renewals. They can only be checked out at the Whitehall Township Public Library and returned inside this library at the circulation desk. You may place a hold on a pass. Overdue fines are \$10.00 a day.

This club is in addition to our general book talks, where we talk about whatever you're reading now. Books will be loaned as availability allows. Book Nook: National Women's History Month

This year's theme for National Women's History Month is "Celebrating Women Who Tell Our Stories". These stories can be found everywhere in the news, social media, books, conversations, blogs, podcasts, television, stages, movie screens, etc. These stories can be true or fiction, personal accounts, someone else's experiences, current time periods, or something from the past. This is the month that American women are recognized for pass-



ing along stories from which we learn something of value, or are just entertained.

If you like **nonfiction**, just wander through our biography sections (adult and juvenile) or the Dewey 920s (collected biographies) and you will discover the famous, the infamous, and the unknown from every profession and every walk of life. Wives, mothers, daughters, sisters, nieces, cousins, friends, and lovers of the famous, infamous, and unknown, too. Why not start with **bestsellers** like *The Light We Carry* by Micelle Obama, *I'm Glad My Mom Died* by Jennette McCurdy, *Finding Me by Viola Davis, Wild by Cheryl Strayed, Live Wire by Kelly Ripa, Educated by Tara Westover, or <i>Untamed by Glennon Doyle?* If you don't have time for a book, here are some **movies** in our DVD collection you might like: *Wild, Erin Brockovich, Julie and Julia, Hidden Figures, and Respect.*

Our library has hundreds of books by hundreds of women authors, and many of their book series were **adapted for television** such as *Rizzoli & Isles* (Tess Gerritsen), *Bones* (Kathy Reichs), *Cedar Cove* (Debbie Macomber), *Chesapeake Shores* (Sherryl Woods), and *Virgin River* (Robyn Carr). Do something different on your next library visit and wander into the stacks, browse through authors, and find yourself a book written by a woman or written about a woman to read in March.


