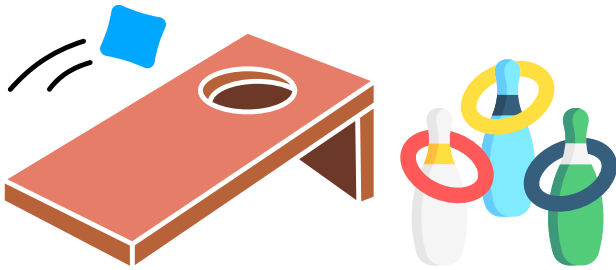
Fraud Prevention

- Saturday, 1 - 3 p.m.: Free (Anything that remains is free to take.)

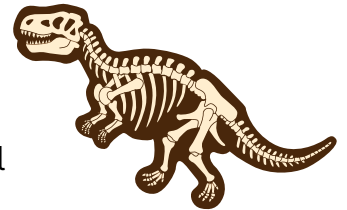

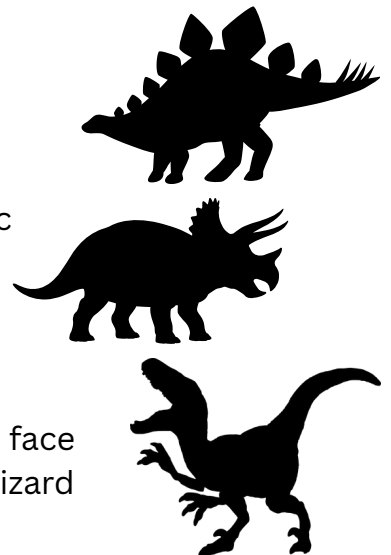

Book Nook: National Back to School Month

Most people think that children having the summer off from school comes from days gone by when there was more farming. But if you are a farmer, you know that the busiest seasons when you need extra help are for spring planting and autumn harvesting. The real reason is that before there was air conditioning, schools got too hot in the summer, especially in cities, and wealthy, and later middle class, families traditionally would relocate to other places for the summer. United States schools' summer breaks average about 80 days. Italy has the longest summer break with about 100 days off. Germany, Switzerland, Australia, New Zealand, Japan, Taiwan, and South Korea all have year-round schooling with shorter breaks between their school terms.



Unfortunately, many students experience what educators call "Summer Slide," when they forget about 40% of what they learned during the school year, especially in math and reading. So, the first 4-6 weeks of the new school year is spent reviewing material from the prior grade. Additionally, children can also suffer mental health problems during the summer because of changes in routines for sleeping, eating, exercise, computer time, and social interaction. Knowing this, public libraries traditionally have their busiest times during the summer by promoting reading and hosting all sorts of activities and programs.

Many schools provide students with required reading lists to do over the summer. If you have a child at home, you may want to find out how many they have checked off their list. We have copies of most required reading books, in case your child needs a copy. Our library also has books to get students ready for school. There are some practical guides and many story books about starting preschool, kindergarten, and first grade. You can use our catalog to find them. If you need help searching, please ask at our circulation desk. Remember, the first day of school for Whitehall Township is August 24th.
